I would further challenge each of us to spend as much time in praise and thanksgiving as we do in opinion sharing or fact checking whoever we disagree with at the moment.

Can you imagine the change that might happen? Can you imagine the possibilities that might unfold? I can, and I hope you will join me.

Applying Bible Principles

The Apostle Paul was a most interesting character whose life almost jumps off the pages of the Bible. He was converted to Christ on the road to Damascus and personified the change described in 2 Corinthians 5:17 that comes to a believer in Christ as "everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new." Even his name changed from Saul of Tarsus to Paul.

That change did not bring with it a life of ease, comfort and pleasure. To the contrary, consider a few of the problems Paul listed in 2 Corinthians 11: Five times he was beaten with 39 stripes; he was shipwrecked three times; he spent at least 24 hours lost at sea; he listed perils of waters, robbers, his countrymen, the Gentiles, the city, the wilderness, and false brethren. And if that weren't enough, he was burdened with the care of all the churches.

As a result, the mighty Apostle Paul spent his time telling everyone he could about all of his problems so that people would feel sorry for him. Over and over, he repeated his litany as part of his solicitation for offerings. Right? Wrong! In all of his writings, he mentions these difficulties only twice.

Here's his testimony: "Not that I am referring to being in need; for I have learned to be content with whatever I have" (Phil. 4:11). One translation uses the word "state" instead of "circumstances." The Apostle wasn't talking about New York, Michigan, or Florida when he referred to "state." Not at all. He was speaking of his condition. Whatever God sent his way, he was content. When he was hungry. When he was thirsty. When he didn't have adequate clothing. When he was beaten for the sake of the Gospel. When he was persecuted.

In light of all of his problems and difficulties, how could he say that he was "content"? Several answers to that question come to mind, including this one two verses later (Phil. 4:13) in which he described his relationship with Christ, "I can do all things through him who strengthens me." In the final analysis, his ability to be "content" was not dependent on his circumstances or his possessions. His contentment was based on his relationship to Christ, on pleasing Christ, on uplifting Christ, on glorifying Christ and on being strengthened by Christ.

Or to put it another way, he had learned what is really important in life, just as he had learned what is really unimportant. Have you learned that lesson? If so, you can say with Paul, "For to me, living is Christ and dying is gain."
